

Mayor Larson called the special City Council meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. Present for roll call were Mayor Larson, Council member Boyd, Council member Glanc, Council member Hilton and Council member Maurer. Also present were City Administrator Patrick Rondinelli, City Resource Director Rick Noll, Public Works Director Dennis Erickson, Chief of Police Justin Perry, Hot Springs Pool Manager Tom Kavanaugh, Assistant Hot Springs Pool Manager Josh Vincent, Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Beverly Martensen, Plaindealer reporter Dalton Carver, and six citizens.

ACTION ITEMS

Hot Springs Pool Fee Admissions Structure

Mayor Larson explained that this discussion is to determine if the daily fees for the pool should be increased for visitors, noting that there will be no changes to membership fees for 2017. There was discussion about the adult, senior, and youth rates being increased by \$4; the 3 punch pass being removed; the 10 punch pass increasing to \$120; the 20 punch pass increasing to \$224; all military (active, retired or veterans) receiving a 20% discount; and the rental rates not changing. Council member Maurer stated that she agrees with most of the proposed increases except that Council promised the citizens of Ouray that their rates would not go up for the first year. Council member Boyd stated that there may be other ways to honor that promise by using 10 or 20 punch passes. Ryan Hein encouraged Council to increase the rates. Rondinelli confirmed that nothing will change for the volunteers and explained that this is a time sensitive issue and if Council chooses to change the rates staff would need to change signage, promotional material and reprogram the point of sale computers before the opening on Memorial Day weekend. Council member Maurer moved and council member Boyd seconded the motion to increase the adult rates by \$6 for senior; and youth rates to increase by \$4; the 3 punch pass being removed; the 10 punch pass increasing to \$120; the 20 punch pass increasing to \$224; all military (active, retired or veterans) receiving a 20% discount; and the rental rates not changing, all effective May 27th, 2017. The motion was unanimously approved.

ADJOURNMENT

At 4:04 p.m., Council member Boyd moved and Council member Glanc seconded the motion to adjourn. The motion was unanimously approved.
